planning on gender issues following UN theme. Near about 1200 participants were participated in the rally with different slogan like 'Each for Equal' 'Process for progress' 'Build a gender balance world'. At Dhaka Mr.Aminul Haque DG BWDB, Mohammad Ali -Additional DG- BWDB, Amirul Hossain-PCD, Team Leader of BGP and other team member of BGP TA team and BWDB attended discussion sessions.
