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FFS Key messages on Homestead Gardening - Vegetables and Fruits

Using the experience gained from some five years' experience of implementing Farmer Field Schools under the Blue Gold Program, five booklets were prepared in August 2018 covering: nutrition, homestead gardening (vegetables and fruits), poultry, fish and beef fattening. The purpose of these booklets was to ensure that all FFS participants had a reference containing the key messages (in Bangla) for their own use, as a recap for what they had learnt, but also as a tool for sharing their learnings with neighbours and friends. The importance of passing on messages to neighbours and friends was actively promoted during the FFS sessions as a contribution to Blue Gold's horizontal learning ambition.

This note provides a translation in English of the key messages from the homestead gardening booklet used in the homestead Farmer Field School (FFS) interventions¹ by the Blue Gold Program.

Farmer Field School - A group-based learning process through which farmers carry out experiential learning activities that help them to understand the ecology of their fields, based on simple experiments, regular field observations and group analysis. The knowledge gained from these activities enables participants to make their own locally specific decisions about crop management practices. This approach represents a radical departure from earlier agricultural extension programmes, in which farmers were expected to adopt generalized recommendations that are

formulated by specialists from outside the community.
